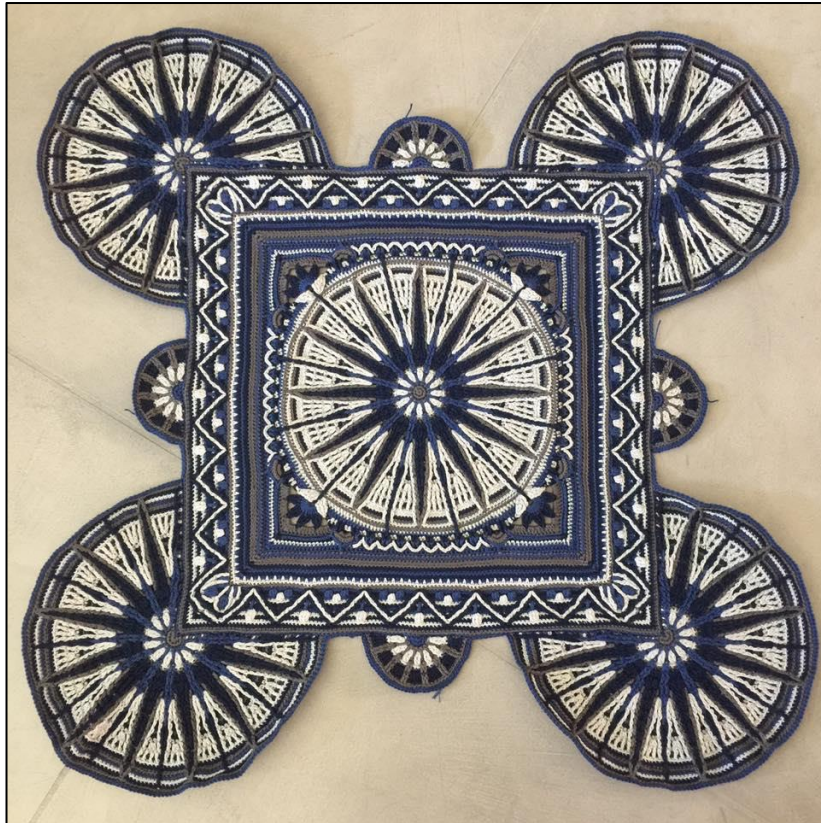


Baby Henry's Designer Heirloom Afghan Crochet Along {PART 11}



In this part, we will be starting the side mandalas.

Resources

- **Incorporated Designs:** This blanket incorporates patterns by three amazing designers. They are all beautifully written patterns with great photo tutorials. **You will need to purchase** “Mandala N°6” by CAROcreated, available on [Ravelry](#) or [Etsy](#), and “Dandelion Border-Overlay Crochet” by [Lilla Bjorn](#), also available on [Ravelry](#) or [Etsy](#). “Sophie’s Garden Squaring” by Dedri Uys is available on her [website](#). To assemble this blanket, you will need these three patterns and the modifications released in this CAL.

You will need yarn, an appropriately sized crochet hook and a tapestry needle for joining. For more details on this see the introduction information.

Abbreviations

This pattern uses US terms

ch	chain	FLtr	front loop treble crochet
sc	single crochet	FPtr	front post treble crochet
hdc	half double crochet	FLtr2Tog	front loop treble crochet 2 together
dc	double crochet	inc	increase/increases
tr	treble crochet	ESS	end slip stitch
FL	front loop	SSS	starting slip stitch
FP	front post	st(s)	stitch(es)
FLdc	front loop double crochet	sk	skip
FPdc	front post double crochet	rd	round

Special Stitches:

Ending Slip Stitch (ESS) – Remove the loop that is on your hook after the last stitch {left photo below}. Insert the hook, from the back, into both loops of the stitch from the round where you will be joining. Pull the loop through to the back. Cut the yarn leaving a tail for weaving in. Pull the tail through the loop {middle photo below}, and pull the tail to tighten the stitch a bit {right photo below} then weave in the ends. You can also watch the [video instructions here](#).



Starting Slip Stitch (SSS) – Insert hook into the indicated stitch in the round where you will be joining {left photo below}. Leaving a tail, pull through a loop of your new working yarn {middle photo below}, ch 1, {right photo below}. Pull the tail to tighten the stitch a bit. I recommend weaving in the ends as you go, either by crocheting over the tail as you complete the round or by another means shortly after completion of round. BEFORE YOU START:

1. Note that all single stitches in this pattern should be worked **BACK-LOOP ONLY** unless otherwise noted.
2. **For most rounds of the side mandalas you will need these instructions and the original pattern. You should read through both the original pattern and these instructions for the round before starting.**
3. I recommend watching this [video](#) that will provide a tutorial on how to do the beginning and end joining.
4. Rounds 72-84 will be repeated on each of the sides of Part 6 to create the four side mandalas.
5. Note that the joins will be rather visible at first. When all partial mandalas are complete, we will be making a slip stitch round that will hide this and make it look much tidier.

Instructions

Rounds 1-71 and 72-111

Instructions are in the previous parts.

Round 72

Count and find the side center stitch on each side of the blanket in round 71, it should be the stitch that is directly above the middle tr-cluster that you made in the dandelion border, mark this stitch on all four sides.



Join yarn with a SSS (*both loops*) in the first stitch before the side center in rd 71.

Working both loops, 3 sc in the marked side center stitch.

End with an ESS (*both loops*) in the first stitch after the side center in rd 71.

(3 stitches per mandala)



Round 73

Join yarn with a SSS (*both loops*) in the 2nd stitch before the side center in rd 71.

Working in both loops, inc in each st.

End with an ESS (*both loops*) in the 2nd stitch after the side center in rd 71.

(6 stitches per mandala)



Round 74

Join yarn with a SSS (*both loops*) in the 3rd stitch before the side center in rd 71.

(BLO) 1 inc, 1 sc, 2 inc, 1 sc, 1 inc.

End with an ESS (*both loops*) in the 3rd stitch after the side center in rd 71.

(10 stitches per mandala)



Round 75

Join yarn with a SSS (*both loops*) in the 4th stitch before the side center in rd 71.

1 inc, 2 sc 3 times, 1 inc.

End with an ESS (*both loops*) in the 4th stitch after the side center in rd 71.

(14 stitches per mandala)



Round 76

Join yarn with a SSS (*both loops*) in the 5th stitch before the side center in rd 71.

1 inc, 3 sc, 1 inc, 4 sc, 1 inc, 3 sc, 1 inc.

End with an ESS (*both loops*) in the 5th stitch after the side center in rd 71.

(18 stitches per mandala)



Round 77

Join yarn with a SSS (*both loops*) in the 6th stitch before the side center in rd 71.

1 sc, FLtr (into the FL of the sc in rd 73 directly below it), (sk 1 st), 1 sc 6 times.

End with an ESS (*both loops*) in the 6th stitch after the side center in rd 71.

(18 stitches per mandala)



Round 78

Join yarn with a SSS (*both loops*) in the 7th stitch before the side center in rd 71.

FLtr2Tog (working both FLtr into the FL of the sc in rd 74 most visible in between the FLtr from rd 77), (sk no st), 3 sc 6 times, FLtr2Tog.

Note: the first FLtr2tog is before the first FLtr and the last FLtr2tog is after the last FLtr.

End with an ESS (*both loops*) in the 7th stitch after the side center in rd 71.

(25 stitches per mandala)



Round 79

Join yarn with a SSS (*both loops*) in the 8th stitch before the side center in rd 71.

Sc in each stitch around.

End with an ESS (*both loops*) in the 8th stitch after the side center in rd 71.

(25 stitches per mandala)



Round 80

Join yarn with a SSS (*both loops*) in the 9th stitch before the side center in rd 71.

2 sc, 2 FLdc (both into the FL of the underlying FLtr in rd 77), (sk 1 st), 1 sc 6 times, 1 sc.

End with an ESS (*both loops*) in the 9th stitch after the side center in rd 71.

(31 stitches per mandala)



Round 81

Join yarn with a SSS (*both loops*) in the 10th stitch before the side center in rd 71.

Sc in each stitch around.

End with an ESS (*both loops*) in the 10th stitch after the side center in rd 71.

(31 stitches per mandala)

Round 82

Join yarn with a SSS (*both loops*) in the 11th stitch before the side center in rd 71.

1 FLdc (in the 1st FL of 79 which is visible before the FLdc of rd 80), 2 FLdc (in the 2nd visible stitch) (sk 3 st), *1 sc, 2FLdc (in each FL of rd 79 which is visible between the FLdc of rd 80), skip 4 sts of rd 81* 5 times, 1 sc, 2 FLdc (in the next FL of 79 which is visible after the FLdc of rd 80), 1 FLdc (in the last visible stitch), (sk 2 st).



End with an ESS (*both loops*) in the 11th stitch after the side center in rd 71.

(32 stitches per mandala)

Round 83

Join yarn with a SSS (*both loops*) in the 12th stitch before the side center in rd 71.

1 sc, *2 sc, 2 FPtr (work these stitches around the underlying FLdc's of round 80), (sk 1 st of rd 82), 2 sc * 6 times, 1 sc.

End with an ESS (*both loops*) in the 12th stitch after the side center in rd 71.

(38 stitches per mandala)



Round 84

Join yarn with a SSS (*both loops*) in the 13th stitch before the side center in rd 71.

1 inc, 2 sc, * 3 sc, 1 inc, 2 sc * 5 times, 3 sc, 1 inc, 1 sc.

End with an ESS (*both loops*) in the 13th stitch after the side center in rd 71.

(45 stitches per mandala)



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
